# **Anchor Set**

# **Anchor Annotation, Paper 1 Score Point 0**

In addition to mechanics errors (no caps, no period), the response changes the meaning of the sentences by dropping the fact that they were plants.

A2

My grandma showed me tiny plant that look like tomatoes.

### Anchor Annotation, Paper 2 Score Point 0

This attempt changes the meaning of the sentences. The plants did not look like tomatoes; they were tiny tomato plants.

My grandma showed me some tiny plants, turns out they were tomatoes.

# **Anchor Annotation, Paper 3 Score Point 0**

This is a comma splice: an instance of using a comma to link two independent clauses (which should instead be linked by a colon, semicolon, or conjunction).

my grandma showed me some tiny plants and they were tomatoes

### Anchor Annotation, Paper 4 Score Point 1

This attempt combines the sentences with the simplest conjunction AND, but several important mechanics errors occur: no caps, no period, and no comma before AND.

her grandma showed her some tiny plants called tomatoes.

### Anchor Annotation, Paper 5 Score Point 1

The student partially alters the meaning by changing the POV from first person to third person (her for my/me), but the key ideas are combined in a correctly worded sentence. The only mechanics error is the missing capital letter.

### **Anchor Annotation, Paper 6 Score Point 1**

This response has several mechanics errors: no caps, no period, and misspelling. However, the student demonstrates the most efficient rewording to combine the sentences.

My grandma showed me some tiny plants, and they were tomatoes.

# **Anchor Annotation, Paper 7 Score Point 2**

Simply adding the conjunction AND is not the best method to combine these sentences, but it does accomplish the task, and this sentence is error-free.

**A8** 

My grandma showed me some tiny tomatoe plants.

# **Anchor Annotation, Paper 8 Score Point 2**

This is the most efficient rewording to combine the sentences, and there are no errors (except tacking on an E to tomato).

**A9** 

My grandma showed me some tiny plants, which turned out to be tomatoes.

# **Anchor Set**

**A**1

She is crossing her fingers.

# **Anchor Annotation, Paper 1 Score Point 0**

This is incorrect. The student has simply restated the idiom without an explanation.

 $\mathbf{A2}$ 

she puts another finger over another finger (and models)

# **Anchor Annotation, Paper 2 Score Point 0**

This is incorrect, as the student is just describing the action or motion of crossing one's fingers.

**A3** 

She is lying because whenever you cross your fingers, it means that you are lying to somebody.

### Anchor Annotation, Paper 3 Score Point 0

While lying is a valid explanation of what it means to cross your fingers, this is completely incorrect within the context of the passage.

she cross her fingers because so the deer won't eat grandmas plants.

### Anchor Annotation, Paper 4 Score Point 1

This explanation is partially correct. There is no "hoping" or other definition of the idiom, which is the task. Details from the passage are not too helpful in responding to the task, but "so the deer won't eat grandmas plants" does weakly imply that she is crossing her fingers as part of a desire for the garden's plants to survive.

### Anchor Annotation, Paper 6 Score Point 1

This explanation is partially correct. You can cross your fingers to hope you get something (correct) or because you are lying (incorrect). Only the first definition is correct within the context of the passage.

Very brief and completely correct. Crossing your fingers means hoping, and in swapping the explanation with the expression, the meaning of the original sentence remains clear: She is hoping that the garden does well.

This is correct. She is crossing her fingers for good luck.

**A9**
