Daybreak

Morning came slowly, this, late in the year (1) a quiet lightening of the sky from purple to dark blue as the stars faded and the first sounds of birdsong broke the pre-dawn quiet. The light crept down the trees in the back yard, flaming at the tips (2) of the tallest maples where their bright red leaves stood out against the deep blue sky. Watching the gradual dawn, the treetops were touched by the sun, then Isla saw it travel down them slowly. (3) She couldn't quite see the light move, but when she looked away, the daylight had spread by the time she looked back. (4)

The last four years of college had felt like that <u>for Isla</u>; most of the time, (5) it had seemed that nothing was changing, one class following another and the busy, stressful, joyful days blending into one another. Then she would look back and realize how far she'd come since the day she first stepped onto the university campus. Now she had a weekend home. It was one last free weekend with her parents. Next would come the rush of first semester exams. (6) And after that, graduation and everything that followed loomed large—a new job maybe, a move, to a new city and, the beginning of a new life (7) that Isla wasn't at all certain that she was ready for.

The sun was beginning to peek through low branches, glowing through the golden leaves as though the leaves were simply filters, <u>nature's special effects</u>. (8) A squirrel ran up the tree chattering, twisted around a branch, and then disappeared into a hole Isla had never noticed before. Was it new, or was it an old <u>refuge</u> (9), a place where squirrels had spent many winters? Maybe even now the squirrel was restocking, putting acorns away for the winter to come. How did it know, she wondered—did the chill in the air at night tell it, or was it the color of the leaves, signaling an <u>ancestral</u> (10) push to gather and hoard, to prepare for the cold weather ahead? One way or another, the squirrels knew; they were hard at work filling their larders. (11)

The sun shifted, rising above the trees now, the first rays penetrating all the way to the ground, <u>iluminnating</u> (12) places beneath the trees as though catching them in a spotlight. Isla smiled and stepped into the light, turning with her hands raised, <u>enjoying this time</u>, because things would be different soon. (13)

Anchor Annotation, Paper 1 Score Point 0

The student rewrote a sentence from another part of the passage, thereby failing to complete the task.

now for one weekned she is at home with her parents before the first semester exams

Anchor Annotation, Paper 2 Score Point 0

There is no end punctuation and the first letter of the sentence is not capitalized. Also, some of the meaning of the original sentence is lost. No credit.

A3

Now that she had a weekend at home. The last one free one she had with her parents. Next would come the rush of first semester grades.

Anchor Annotation, Paper 3 Score Point 0

There is no attempt to create a single sentence; this is still three sentences. Keep in mind that the prompt asks, "Combine underlined sentences 6 into a single, effective sentence." If the response contains multiple sentences, it will be score point 0.

Now she had a weekend home ,it was one last free weekend with her parents ,Next would come the rush of the first semester exams.

Anchor Annotation, Paper 4 Score Point 0

The two comma splices fail to effectively combine sentences, making this response a score point 0.

A5

Now she was home for one last weekend with her parents, before the next rush of first semester exams.

Anchor Annotation, Paper 5 Score Point 1

Some meaning is lost without the word "free" ("one last free weekend"), so this response earns partial credit.

A6

Now she had a weekend home; next would come the rush of the first semester.

Anchor Annotation, Paper 6 Score Point 1

The new, combined sentence leaves out the idea of Isla being with her parents and of the exam. In order to be effective, the rewritten sentence should have the same impact as the original. Being with her parents is critical to the point the author is trying to make.

Now she had one last free weekend with her parents; next would come the rush of her semester exams.

Anchor Annotation, Paper 7 Score Point 2

This response leaves out the word "first" regarding semester exams, but that minor omission does not affect the sentence in such a way as to lower the score. In fact, leaving out "first" is—in a sense—a correct way to edit this response, since the passage indicates that Isla is finishing college. Given that she is finishing, these would not be *first* semester exams.

A8

It was her last free weekend home with her parents until the rush of first semester exams.

Anchor Annotation, Paper 8 Score Point 2

This is an effective combination of the three original sentences.

A9

Now she had one last free weekend at home with her parents before the rush of first semester exams.

Anchor Annotation, Paper 9 Score Point 2

This is another effective combination of the three original sentences.

Anchor Set

A1

Because leaves changes colors according to season change.

Anchor Annotation, Paper 1 Score Point 0

There is no understanding and no reference to a connection to the passage. The student did not speak to the sunlight coming through the leaves, but rather spoke to leaves changing color with the seasons. This is basically a generic comment on nature. No credit.

 $\mathbf{A2}$

This phrase is showing how the sun makes nature seem more glamourous.

Anchor Annotation, Paper 2 Score Point 0

The meaning of "nature's special effects" is not addressed in a manner relevant to the sun's interaction with the leaves. Rather, the student wrote about the sun making nature seem more glamorous. There is no discussion of imagery. No credit.

A3

Beautiful scenery created by nature.

Anchor Annotation, Paper 3 Score Point 0

This response gives a definition of "nature's special effects" but fails to connect that definition to how the sun looks coming through the leaves.

It gives an imagery on the effect the sun is giving the leaves and when the sun gives the leaves a different color tone, it shows the detail that the sun is putting on to the leaves.

Anchor Annotation, Paper 4 Score Point 1

The student tries to give meaning to the phrase, "nature's special effects" with some, but limited, context. The student does write about imagery, which is one of the ways to reach a Score Point 1.

A5

It's talking the imagery that the passage is saying, and how the sun is doing all these different things. How the positions, and where the sun is at provides these "special effects" to the scenerie that she is in.

Anchor Annotation, Paper 5 Score Point 1

The student writes about the imagery in the passage, which is helpful to get to a Score Point 1. Some attempt is made to reference the context of the passage. The sun and what it's doing is referencing the sentences leading up to "nature's special effects," whereas "the scenerie that she is in" references Isla. Both the discussion of imagery and the discussion of context remain vague (doing all these different things; the scenerie that she is in), keeping the response partially correct. Score Point 1.

A6

The author wanted us to know that sunlight has a big effect on how we see the world. The glare from the sun was described as "glowing" showing natures effects.

Anchor Annotation, Paper 6 Score Point 1

The response offers some explanation on the context and meaning of the phrase, "nature's special effects." The student partially explains the underlined phrase in the context of the story.

The descriptive phrase was used in context with life. In the story, Isla is comparing her schooling to nature. This phrase (and the paragraph) are continuing from the beginning of the story where the writer began with the comparison of nature to Isla's life.

Anchor Annotation, Paper 7 Score Point 2

The student connects the phrase to the purpose of the entire passage. By comparing Isla's schooling to nature, the student correctly performs the task. Here, we're seeing more specificity on both imagery and context.

A8

The underlined phrase "nature's special effects" serves to show that the sun could shine anywhere despite anything blocking its way, such as the leaves. It also goes to add more vivid imagery to the story, providing a more detailed setting for the reader to understand Isla's viewpoint on dawn.

Anchor Annotation, Paper 8 Score Point 2

The student understands and explains what "nature's special effects" means to this passage. The student understands the use of figurative language by comparing the sun shining through the leaves with Isla's viewpoint on dawn.

The phrase describes the light as it passes through the low branches and leaves of the tree. It shows that the sunight is shining through the gaps of the branches and leaves. This phrase also represents Isla as she thinks about what she will do after college. Isla is looking past the end of her time at college, the branches in this symbolism, and trying to figure out what she is going to do next in life.

Anchor Annotation, Paper 9 Score Point 2

The writer provides an insightful connection of the phrase, "nature's special effects" to the entire passage. The writer strongly connects context ("This phrase also represents Isla as she thinks about what she will do after college") with imagery.
