Anchor Set

A1

He is being filmed for the abunce of lake activites.

Anchor Annotation, Paper 1 Score Point 0

This response fails to perform the task. Using the pronoun "He" (rather than "him" from the phrase students are asked to edit) is not anymore specific and does not identify or emphasize who filmed the movie. The task centers on naming the correct individual that filmed the movie, so additional errors are not considered.

A2

A short movie the abundance of the lake activities here are being filmed by liam

Anchor Annotation, Paper 2 Score Point 0

This response fails to perform task. Liam is an incorrect answer for naming the individual who films the movie.

A3

Liam was filming a short movie about the abundance of lake activities here

Anchor Annotation, Paper 3 Score Point 0

This response fails to perform the task. Liam is an incorrect answer for naming the individual who films the movie.

A4

the camra man films the short movie about the abundance of lake activities

Anchor Annotation, Paper 4 Score Point 1

This response is partially correct. The "camra man" gets closer to establishing who filmed the movie, as the passage detail about Cameron holding a camera is relevant, but "emphasis" requires Cameron to be identified by name.

A movie about the abundance of lake activities is filmed by a friend of liam

Anchor Annotation, Paper 5 Score Point 1

This response is partially correct. It establishes that the filmmaker is a "friend of liam," which is a correct detail from the passage, but the response does not include his name (Cameron).

A6

A short movie about the abundance of ake activities here is being filmed by the man with the movie camera.

Anchor Annotation, Paper 6 Score Point 1

This response is partially correct. The "man with the movie camera" is a relevant detail from the passage to establish the filmmaker, but the response is incomplete without his name (Cameron).

A7

A short movie about the abundance of lake activities here is being filmed by my friend Cameron for a local news station.

Anchor Annotation, Paper 7 Score Point 2

This response earns full credit. It clearly identifies Cameron as the person who filmed the movie. Note: the use of active or passive voice does not impact the score; "Cameron filmed the movie" and "The movie is being filmed by Cameron" are equally correct.

Cameron had filmed a short movie about the abundance of lake activities

Anchor Annotation, Paper 8 Score Point 2

This response earns full credit. It correctly identifies Cameron as the person who filmed the movie.

Anchor Set

A1

take the lake cumberlan by the storm.

Anchor Annotation, Paper 1 Score Point 0

This response fails to perform the task. It restates the idiom without attempting an explanation.

A2

there was a storm.

Anchor Annotation, Paper 2 Score Point 0

This response fails to perform the task. It is an incorrect literal interpretation. To "take Lake Cumberland by storm" does not mean there is a rainstorm over the lake.

 $\mathbf{A3}$

Abunch of people going to lake cumberland.

Anchor Annotation, Paper 3 Score Point 0

This response fails to perform the task. The idiom does not mean for a large group to suddenly converge and conquer a space like "storm the castle." The expected definition centers around heightened and immersive activity that is fun, exciting, and popular. This response falls short of partial credit, as the response is too vague to work within the context of the passage.

 $\mathbf{A4}$

They are saying that they are going to take over the lake and show what it is about.

Anchor Annotation, Paper 4 Score Point 1

This response is partially correct. The student shows some understanding of the idiom with "take over the lake," but "show what it is about" is too vague for full credit.

they are saying they are gonna have a good titme and secssede in having a good trip with nothing bad happening because arent going to let anything get in its way

Anchor Annotation, Paper 5 Score Point 1

This response is partially correct. The student has some success in defining the idiom, expressing a desire to have a good time, succeed in having a good trip, and have a good outcome because nothing would be allowed to get in the way. However, the vague nature of the response (good time; good trip; nothing bad) limit the effectiveness of the definition.

A6

I believe line 13 means that Marissa, Joel, Cameron, and Liam are going to go have a lot of fun at the beach.

Anchor Annotation, Paper 6 Score Point 1

This response is partially correct. To "have a lot of fun" is part of an appropriate definition, but by itself is incomplete. To "take by storm" entails vigor, enthusiasm, and decisive action. This response is tepid by comparison, but it is a good starting point for full credit.

A7

The phrase "take Lake Cumberland by storm" the meaning is like all of a sudden just be popular like make a good song and you could say we are going to take such and such by storm.

Anchor Annotation, Paper 7 Score Point 2

This response earns full credit. The explanation that to "take by storm" means "all of a sudden just be popular" is correct. The positive notion of a swift (all of a sudden) success (popularity) lies at the heart of the idiom. The example of making a good song is not as clearly connected to the passage, but the overall effort demonstrates complete understanding of the task.

The meaning of underlined phrase 13 is that the people in this story are going to have a fun time, and they are going to get everything out of the Lake Cumberland expierence that they can.

Anchor Annotation, Paper 8 Score Point 2

This response earns full credit. It is a correct interpretation of the idiom – to have a fun time and get everything out of the experience that they can. Since the goal of the day is to have fun, getting everything out of the experience they can IS taking the lake by storm.

A9

To take something by storm is to do something with great effort and energy meaning they are going to do the lake activities and film that movie in the most exiciting ways possible.

Anchor Annotation, Paper 9 Score Point 2

This response earns full credit. Doing something with "great effort and energy" aligns with the enthusiasm and vigor definition of the idiom. Conducting and filming the activities in the "most exiciting ways possible" reaffirms this and also brings in the "fun" element.
