## The Ferry

It was, by anyone's standards, just another rather <u>run-of-the-mill</u> (1) late summer day in Woods Hole, Massachusetts. Although, the sun had yet to make its debut, workers of all ranks, and classifications were preparing for the onslaught of travelers, who would soon descend upon the <u>tiny town</u>. (2) Most would arrive with the singular intention of catching the 45-minute ferry ride to their ultimate destination somewhere on Martha's Vineyard. In spite of the focused and somewhat frenzied pace of work being done to prepare everything from the boarding ramp to the snack bar, there was an overall sense of <u>tranquility</u> (3) and quiet confidence. The weather forecast, even the timing of the sunrise, suggested the day ahead would be <u>uneventful</u> (4) and relaxing. No one could have possibly predicted the turn of events that was waiting to unfold.

The managing of the snack bar on the main level of the ferry was an enviable job. Most of my college friends coveted it. Some coveted it secretly. Others coveted it openly, while others did it aggressively. (5) Although the hours of my daily shift were less than palatable (6), initially wreaking havoc on (7) my naturally nocturnal rhythm of life, I had learned to embrace the pre-dawn wake-up calls and often tricky bike rides through the dark (8) and sleepy streets of my beloved Woods Hole.

As I was preparing the coffee and pastries for the day's first group of passengers, I sensed a slight increase in the rocking of the ferry. Glancing, at the weather app; on my phone, I was reasured to see that, indeed, there were no storms on the horizon. (9) I could see, from my vantage in the snack bar, that a pristine day ahead was being given every indication of happening due to the darkness outside being overtaken by a brilliant sunrise. (10) And, yet, the rocking of the ferry became increasingly pronounced. I began to hear louder than typical voices from the crew on the dock and the ramp. Then, I lost my balance. Then, for a brief moment, my stomach somersaulted. (11) What is happening?

Without warning, the ferry suddenly jolted to the right, slamming into the dock, causing the ramp to crash down into the increasingly <u>turbulent</u> (12) waters below. Since it had not occurred to me to secure the glass dishes, they became projectiles, sliding easily off the counters until they were airborne, ultimately smashing onto the tiled floor below. <u>Between two counters</u>, I steadied myself, and, to see what would happen next, I waited with baited breath. (13)

#### Anchor Annotation, Paper 1 Score Point 0

This response receives no credit. The basic misunderstanding here is that the snack bar is what was coveted rather than the managerial job. There is a run-on sentence (after "snack bar") and an incorrectly placed comma after "it." Moreover, the initial word is not capitalized.

 $\mathbf{A2}$ 

Everyone had their own different ways of coveting the snack bar on the main level of the ferry.

#### Anchor Annotation, Paper 2 Score Point 0

The response receives no credit. The sentence rewrite takes liberties with the original: "everyone" is too broad (should be "most of my college friends"), and the individuals did not covet the snack bar itself but the job there. Also, "own different ways" is too vague and does not capture the gradation of coveting included in the original.

A3

Most of my college friends coveted it. some coveted it differntly, Althought others coveted it openly, while others did it agressivly.

#### Anchor Annotation, Paper 3 Score Point 0

This response receives no credit. It creates two sentences, and the prompt specifically asks for "a single, effective sentence." Moreover, the missing capitalization of "some," and the incorrectly capitalized "Althought" create awkwardness. The various misspellings are ignored, as they do not create different words or usage problems. Note that misspelled words from the original text are not considered errors.

Most of my college friends convented it; some conveted secretly, others conveted it openly, while others did aggressively.

#### Anchor Annotation, Paper 4 Score Point 1

This response is partially correct. It replaces periods with a semicolon and two commas to create one sentence, but there is no attempt to reduce wordiness ("improve effectiveness"). The consistent misspelling of "coveted" is ignored, as it does not create a different word from the original text.

**A5** 

Whether openly or secretly most coveted it, some even aggressively.

#### Anchor Annotation, Paper 5 Score Point 1

This response is partially correct. It's missing a comma after "secretly" (introductory clause), and it is not fully effective since it deletes an integral part of the sentence ("Most of my college friends").

**A6** 

Most of my college friends coveted it; some secretly, others openly, and others aggresively.

#### Anchor Annotation, Paper 6 Score Point 1

This response is partially correct. There is an incorrect use of a semicolon. The misspelled word "aggresively" is ignored, as it does not create a different word.

**A7** 

Most of my college friends coveted it, whether it be secretly, aggressively, or openly.

#### Anchor Annotation, Paper 7 Score Point 2

This response receives full credit. The sentence rewrite presents an effective solution that eliminates much of the unnecessary repetition with the "whether it be" construction.

Most of my college friends coveted it: some secretly, some openly, and some aggressively.

# **Anchor Annotation, Paper 8 Score Point 2**

This response receives full credit. The sentence rewrite presents an effective solution with a grammatically appropriate use of a colon.

**A9** 

Either secretly, openely, or agrresively, most of my college friends coveted it.

This response receives full credit. It is a well-written, concise rephrasing.

## **Anchor Set**

**A1** 

I seen the sun rise from the snack bar ande knew its a good day

#### Anchor Annotation, Paper 1 Score Point 0

This response does not receive any credit. The student does not include any of the details about the pristine day, the darkness outside, or the sunrise.

 $\mathbf{A2}$ 

I could see, from the snack bar that a pristine day was ahead. Being given every indication that a nice day was due to the darkness outside covering up the sun.

#### Anchor Annotation, Paper 2 Score Point 0

This response does not receive any credit. There are two sentences containing a serious misunderstanding that make this rephrasing difficult to follow ("... was due to the darkness outside covering up the sun").

**A3** 

as i looked through the vantage in the snack bar, the sun that wa rising indicated the end of the night.

# Anchor Annotation, Paper 3 Score Point 0

This response receives no credit. There is a serious misunderstanding ("as i looked through the vantage") along with a general and vague attempt to summarize. There is no improvement over the original.

 $\mathbf{A4}$ 

I could see, from my vantage in the snack bar, that a pristine day would happen due to the darkness being overtaken by a brilliant sunrise.

# **Anchor Annotation, Paper 4 Score Point 1**

This response receives partial credit. It is quite close in wording and sequencing to the original but does improve by using the more concise and more appropriate "a pristine day would happen."

As I sat at the snack bar, I could tell that a pristine day was ahead as the the sun overtook the darkness.

#### **Anchor Annotation, Paper 5 Score Point 1**

This response receives partial credit. This solution, although fluent, glosses over many details from the original ("my vantage," "brilliant sunrise," ...).

**A6** 

I could see, from in the snack bar, that the pristine day ahead was going to happen as the brilliant sunrise began overtaking the darkness outside.

#### Anchor Annotation, Paper 6 Score Point 1

This response receives partial credit. There is not much improvement in the first part of this rewrite (even leaving off "my vantage"). However, it does improve in the second half ("the brilliant sunrise began overtaking the darkness outside").

**A7** 

From my vantage in the snack bar, I could see that a pristine day was ahead due to the darkness outside being overtaken by a brilliant sunrise.

#### Anchor Annotation, Paper 7 Score Point 2

This response receives full credit. This new sentence construction is nicely rearranged. The small change of words does not change the meaning.

**A8**

# **Anchor Annotation, Paper 2 Score Point 0**

The response receives a score of 0. There is no initial capitalized letter, and it does not include end punctuation. Also, "baited breath" is misunderstood.

# Anchor Annotation, Paper 3 Score Point 0

The response receives no credit. It contains a comma splice (after "next"). Remember that a comma splice renders a response a score point 0. Also, there is no real improvement in this response because it maintains the odd organization of the original.

#### Anchor Annotation, Paper 4 Score Point 1

The response receives partial credit. Overall, there is some improvement. The misspelling is ignored ("eaited"), and the superfluous comma before "to see" is a minor issue.

#### Anchor Annotation, Paper 5 Score Point 1

The response receives a score of 1. There are some improvements, but the wording is still a bit awkward due to the initial passive language (Between two counters, I steadied myself).
