What Is an Airport?

- 1 You pull your bags to the window and look outside. You can see huge airplanes all over the runway. One of them moves closer to your window. You will get on this plane in a few minutes. Where are you? You are at the airport!
- 2 People go to airports when they travel by plane. Some people fly across the country. Others travel all over the world.
- 3 Who do you ask if you have questions at the airport? Airport workers can help answer your questions!

Airport Workers

4 Who do you talk to when you get to the airport? You speak to a ticket agent. He looks at your ticket. He also helps you with your luggage. The ticket agent can tell you which gate you need to find. You will board the plane at the gate.



- 5 You will meet security workers on your way to the gate. They make sure you follow some simple rules that will keep everyone safe. Security workers look carefully at anything you bring on the plane. They work very hard to make sure that you are safe. They are happy to answer any questions you might have.
- 6 Controllers are important airport workers. They give instructions to pilots. They help them land their planes safely.
- 7 Controllers also give directions to workers on the runway. The runway is a busy place. Planes are moving back and forth. People often drive trucks and cars between these planes. Controllers make sure that everyone on the runway has enough space to do their jobs safely.
- 8 Does anyone else work at the airport? Yes! Many different workers are at an airport. Baggage handlers load and unload luggage on planes. Mechanics fix any planes that have broken parts. They also check to make sure that planes are safe. Custodians help keep the airport clean. They pick up trash. They also vacuum the airport and clean the restrooms.
- 9 On the plane, you might see the pilots and flight attendants. The pilot and copilot fly the plane. Flight attendants make sure passengers have a safe and enjoyable flight.

Do You Want to Work at the Airport?

- 10 Does working at an airport interest you? This is something you can start thinking about now. Talk to some workers the next time you visit the airport. Also, find out if an airport near you offers tours.
- 11 People do many different jobs at the airport. Watch the airport workers doing their jobs. You may learn that many airport workers enjoy traveling. Most are good at helping other people. An airport can be an exciting place to work. Learn as much as you can now. Then you can decide if working at the airport is right for you!

Anchor Set

A1

The auther supports the story by talking about airplans.

Anchor Annotation, Paper 1 Score Point 0

The student response is irrelevant. The question is not answered and there are no details from the passage provided (*The auther supports the story by talking about airplans*).

A2

they pick up trash they also vacuum the airport and clean the restrooms so we will not get sick.

Anchor Annotation, Paper 2 Score Point 0

The student response is incorrect and does not answer the question. The details provided are irrelevant (*they pick up trash they also vacuum the airport and clean the restrooms so we will not get sick*).

A3

The author support claim that an aiport can be an exciting to work at because people at the airport.

Anchor Annotation, Paper 3 Score Point 0

The student response is irrelevant, making no attempt to answer the question or provide details from the passage.

The author supports the claim by telling what the workers do at the airport.

Anchor Annotation, Paper 4 Score Point 1

The student provides a partially correct response, where they describe how the author supports the claim that airports are exciting places to work (by telling what the workers do at the airport), but they do not provide details from the passage.

A5

the author supports that the airport is a very exciting place to work . the text states the airport workers are always happy to answer questions or help people .

Anchor Annotation, Paper 5 Score Point 1

The student provides a partially correct response, where they do not describe how the author supports the claim that airports are exciting places to work, but they do provide details from the passage (the airport workers are always happy to answer questions or help people).

The airport could be exciting place to work because you can be one of the workers and you can help people where they need to go.

Anchor Annotation, Paper 6 Score Point 1

The student provides a partially correct response, where they describe how the author supports the claim that airports are exciting places to work (because you can be one of the workers and you can help people where they need to go), but they do not provide details from the passage.

An airport can be exiting to work because there are so many different jobs that are fun to do!!! You can be a pilot and drive a plane!!

Anchor Annotation, Paper 7 Score Point 2

The student accurately describes how the author supports the claim that airports are exciting places to work (because there are many different jobs that are fun to do). Details from the passage are provided as support (You can be a pilot and drive a plane).

A8

Being an airport worker can be a exiting place to work because you will be able to help people and meet people. Also a controller helps give directions to the pilots so they can land safely and that everyone on the runway has enough space to do their jobs safely.

Anchor Annotation, Paper 8 Score Point 2
